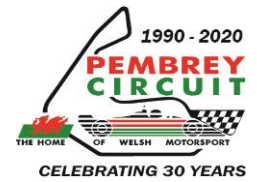

The British Automobile Racing Club Ltd., Thruxton Circuit, Andover, Hampshire. SP11 8PN will organise a Interclub permit RALLYCROSS meeting No: **t. b. a.** on 27th & 28th April 2024 using the Pembrey (Rallycross) circuit.

Programme: Saturday 27th & Sunday 28th April 2024.

Sign on (Both Days) – By Pre Event Declaration. **Scrutineering** – Saturday 27th April @ 07:00am & Sunday 28th April @ 08:00am **Observed Laps** – Saturday 27th April @ 09:00am & Sunday 28th April @ 09:00am. **Practice** – Saturday 27th April @ 09:10am & Sunday 28th April @ 09:10am. **Heats** – Saturday 22nd April @ 10:20am & Sunday 28th April @ 10:20am

The meeting will be held under the General Regulations of Motorsport UK (incorporating the provisions of the International Sporting Code of the FIA), these and any further Supplementary Regulations issued, the BARC Standing Supplementary Regulations and any further written instructions that the Organising Club may issue for the event. Entries open on publication of these Supplementary Regulations.

Direction & length of Circuit:- Saturday 27th April – Clockwise Length : 0.666 miles/1.072 kilometres & Sunday 28th April - Anti – Clockwise Length : 0.666 miles/1.072 kilometres

ELIGIBLE COMPETITORS: All competitors must be holders of a current, valid and relevant Racing Licence & Medical Certificate, applicable to the event, its status and/or championship or race in question. Licences and Club Membership Cards will need to be emailed into the Organising Club prior to the event. The event is open to fully paid up valid card holding members of: BTRDA, CDMC, NEACC, BARC, LHMC & DDMC, plus invited drivers from the MDA (Minicross Drivers Association), CKMC (County Kildare Motor Club), and CMC (Carlow Motor Club). This event is NCAFP listed so competitors with non Motorsport UK licences can compete.

INVITED CLUBS / CHAMPIONSHIPS: BTRDA, LHMC, CDMC, NEACC, BARC, DMC, MDA, CKMC & CMC

ENTRIES AND STARTERS: The organisers have the right to select or refuse entries as they see fit. The maximum number of entries for the meeting is 120. The Minimum is 40. Should any of the minimum figures not be reached the organisers have the right to cancel or amalgamate races or classes as necessary.

ENTRY DEFINITIONS: Each basic entry will qualify for **5 personnel passes** for the meeting. Each entry will qualify the competitor for a listing in the official programme of the Entrant / Sponsor / Team name. This listing will be to a maximum of six words and must contain no offensive or misleading statements and all other restrictions on types of advertising must be respected, MOTORSPORT UK H28. For all entries made supported by an International or National Entrants Licence, the listing in the programme must match the title on the Entrants Licence.

ACCEPTANCE / REFUSAL OF ENTRIES: Entries will be accepted up to the closing date specified on this form subject to the maximum numbers specified above. Electronic entries will only be accepted if they are sent in accordance with MOTORSPORT UK D12.2. All entries received, will be held in abeyance unprocessed, if they are incomplete or are not accompanied by the entry fee. **No entries will be accepted after 12.00 noon on Wednesday 19th April 2024 unless a prior arrangement has been made by the competitor concerned.** As part of the criteria for agreeing to any revised deadline, an entry form and payment must be received by the Secretary of the Meeting. Any change of entry must be in accordance with MOTORSPORT UK D25.1.12.

RESULTS AND PROTESTS: Provisional results will be published as soon as possible after each qualifying session and race via the TSL Timing Website. Protests should be made in accordance with MOTORSPORT UK C5. Bulletins will be posted on the BARC Online Virtual Noticeboard.

SCRUTINEERING ETC.: All vehicles must comply with MOTORSPORT UK Vehicle, Formula and Tyre regulations. Competition numbers must conform to MOTORSPORT UK Vehicle regulations. Parc Fermé is located next to the Scrutineering Bay.

REGULATIONS: Grids for the finals will be decided by either: - Adding together the two lowest points scores when 3 heats are run or the single lowest score if only 2 or less heats are run. Each competitor will be eligible for a final, with the 1st two in each final moving on to the rear of the grid for the next higher final. An allowance of 5 minutes will be scheduled for refuelling. All other Regulations of the MOTORSPORT UK,

Championship Regulations, BARC Standing Supplementary Regulations, BARC Health and Safety Guidelines and any other SR's issued by the organisers must be adhered to at all times.

AWARDS: Awards will be presented at the end of the meeting as follows:- (Any award due to a competitor who fails to attend the prize-giving will be forfeit)

1 st In Class	An award
2 nd In Class	An award (subject to least 3 cars starting)
3 rd In Class	An award (subject to least 6 cars starting)

INSURANCE: All competitors are insured in respect of Third Party liability during official practice and racing. For further details see the current MOTORSPORT UK Yearbook.

FHR: All competitors are required to wear FHR equipment whilst competing in Rallycross from 2019 onwards. For standards and fitting information, please consult Motorsport UK 2024 Yearbook, Regulations K13, N5.9.5 & Drawing #39 Section K Page 205.

IN-CAR CAMERA: All Competitors are required to carry a forward facing in-car camera. This camera must be recording at all times whilst on track and this footage must be made available to the Clerk of the Course. One member of the drivers team will be allowed access to the dummy grid to switch on cameras, this person MUST be signed on and be wearing a wrist band. For all Camera specifications and mounting positions, please consult the BTRDA Championship Regulations.

NCAFP: This event will be open to competitors holding licence from EU and Non-EU countries and is required to have NCAFP coverage in place prior to the start of the event. Competition Licences issued by countries outside the UK. (Art. H 25.2.1) National Competition Licences (and greater, i.e. International) issued by all countries outside the UK (including EU) will be deemed valid, providing: The competitor must sign a declaration that he/she is competent to compete in that status of Race and must satisfy the Clerk of the Course prior to practice that he/she is aware of the flag signals. The competitor will be subject to special observation during practice and must achieve a lap time of at least 120% of the class best unless the Clerk of the Course is aware of extenuating circumstances. In addition, competitors must obtain approval from their own ASN. (For clarity, in the USA, the ASN is ACCUS, and in Japan the JAF). Therefore, ensure that you have the necessary written permission from your ASN, as failure to comply will likely result in you being unable to take part in the event./regional racing club, such as the SCCA etc., it will not be valid.
